CCH Test Centre (Main Written Test): Camden Court Hotel, Lower Camden Street, Dublin 2.

CES Dame Court Test Centre (Speaking Test): Centre of English Studies, Dame Court, Dublin 2.

Walking Directions to the CCH Test Centre – Main Written Test

- The main test takes place in the **Camden Court Hotel** on Lower Camden Street which is a 15 minute walk from Dame Street/CES.
- From the main CES building (31 Dame Street), walk west to the intersection with South Great George's Street. Turn left onto South Great George's Street. Keep walking straight up South Great George's Street onto Aungier Street, up Wexford Street, and onto Camden Street. The Camden Court Hotel is located just past the Bleeding Horse Pub on the left.

Public Transport to the CCH Test Centre

- **By bus:** Take the 9, 15, 16 or 83 bus from South Great George's Street (the stop beside the George's Street Arcade) to the top of Camden Street (the stop beside the Centra newsagent) and walk up to the Bleeding Horse Pub and the Camden Court Hotel.
- **By LUAS:** Take the Green Line Luas to the Harcourt stop. Walk up Charlotte Way past the Garda Headquarters building on the right to the Bleeding Horse Pub on the left. Turn left and walk past the pub to the main entrance to the Camden Court Hotel.

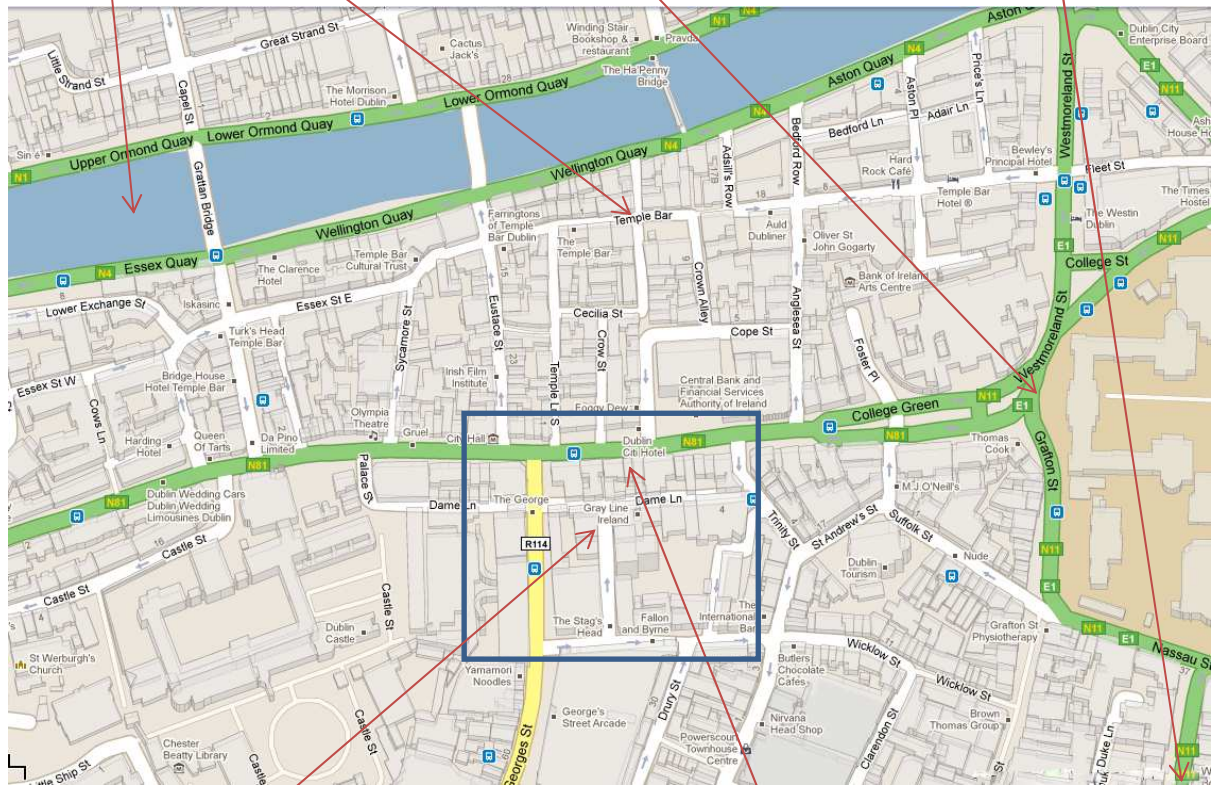
Directions to the CES Dame Court Test Centre – Speaking Test

- Walk past the main CES building (31 Dame Street).
- Turn left into the narrow alleyway in between William Hill betting shop and the Mercantile hotel. Walk straight up Dame Court for 50 metres.
- The CES Test Centre is on the right, just before Odessa restaurant.

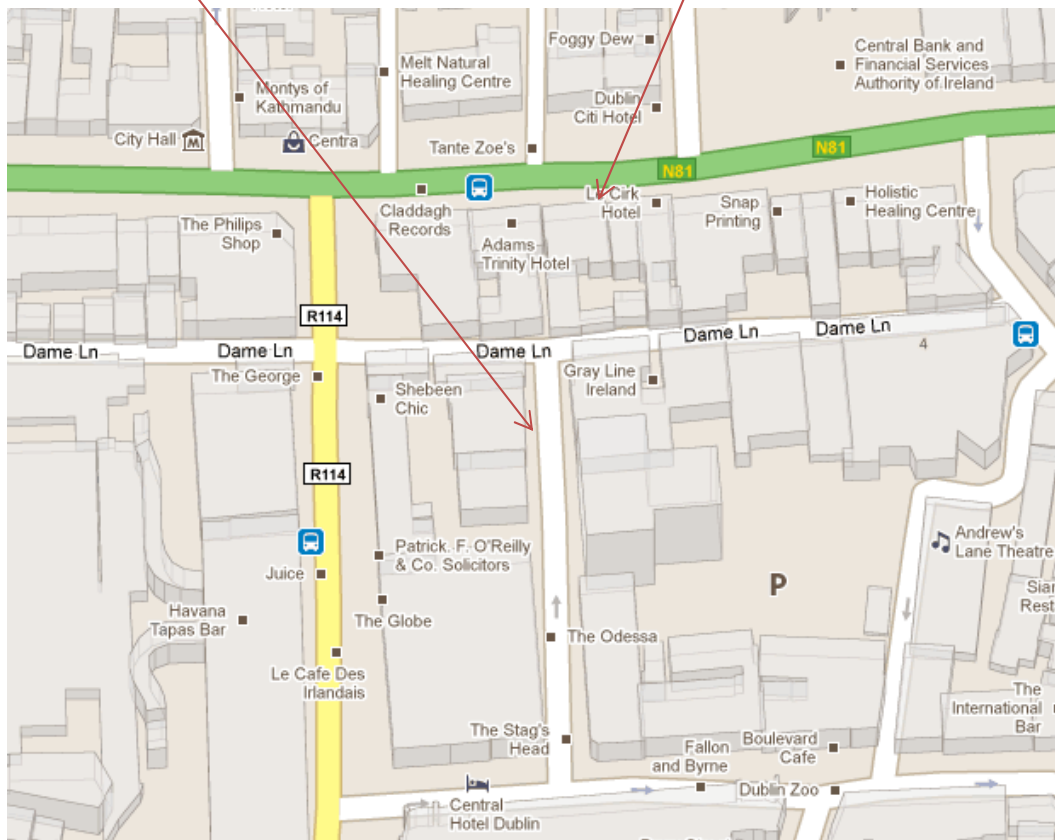

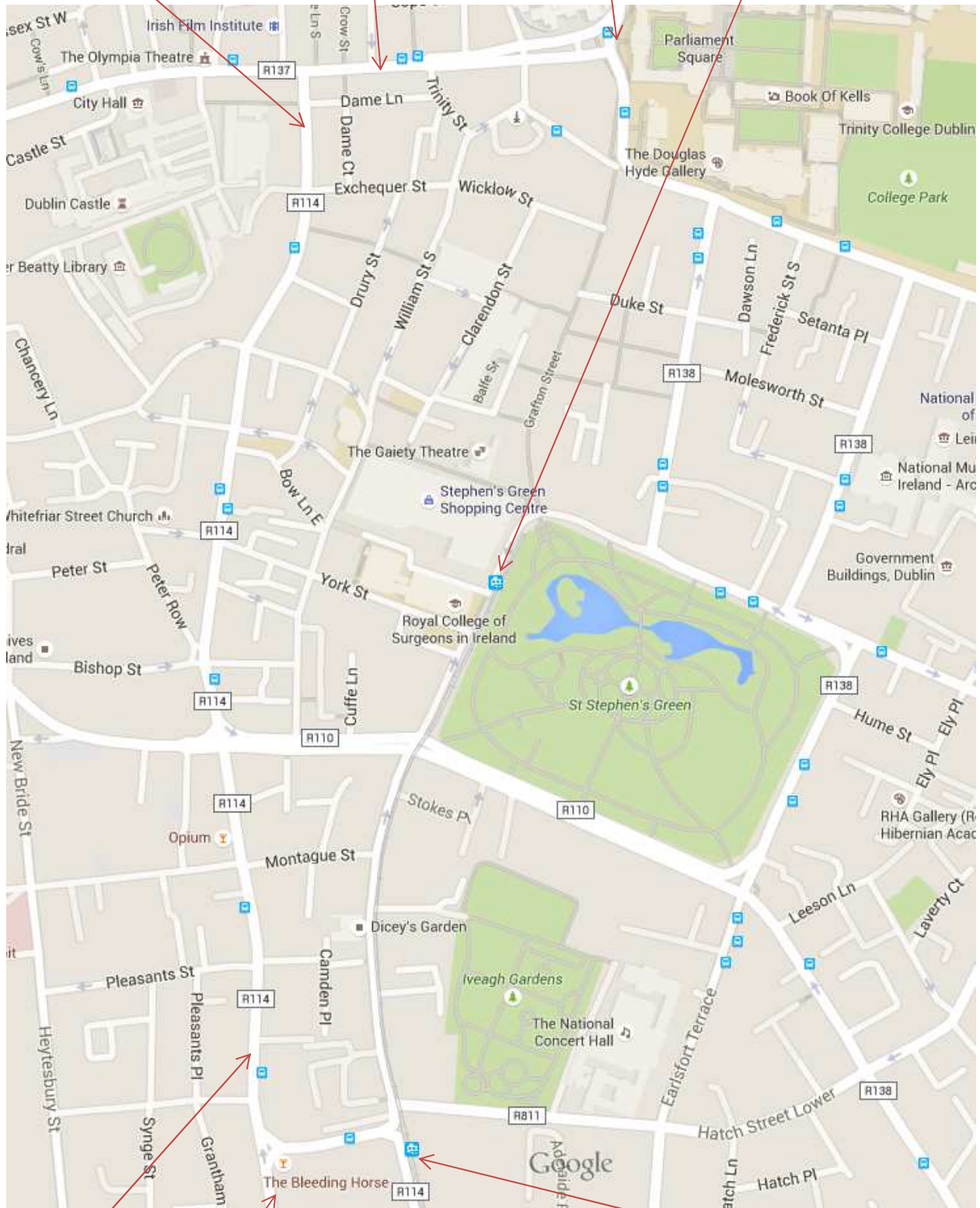

Getting to and from Dublin

Rail: Dublin is connected to all major cities and towns in Ireland by train. See www.irishrail.ie for more information.

Heuston station: If you travel from a city or town in the west of Ireland, such as Cork, Limerick, Galway, Tralee and Waterford, you will arrive in Heuston station.

Connolly Station: If you travel from towns and cities along the east coast of Ireland and Northern Ireland, such as Belfast, Maynooth and Wexford, you will arrive in Connolly Station.

Bus: Dublin is connected to all major cities and towns in Ireland by bus. See <http://www.buseireann.ie/> for more information.

The main bus station in Dublin (called Busaras) is located in the city centre close to Connolly station. It is a 20 minute walk to the city centre or you can take the LUAS (red line to Abbey Street Station: €1.80) or take a taxi (approximately €7).

From within Dublin city and country

DART Suburban train: The DART services Dublin suburbs, such as Howth, Dun Laoghaire and Bray, along the north and south coasts. There are regular trains to Tara Street Station in the city centre. Fares range between €1.70 and €4.40. See www.dart.ie for further information

LUAS Light rail system: There are currently two lines. The red line travels from west from the city centre servicing Connolly Station, Busaras, Hueston Station and Tallaght. The green line runs from Stephen's Green to Harcourt Street and then southside suburbs such as Ranelagh, Dundrum and Stillorgan. Fares range from €1.50 - €4.70. See www.luas.ie for further information.

Dublin Bus: There are a wide range of buses that service the city centre from the suburbs. Fares range from €1.20 to €4.60 and discount passes are available if you have a Student Travel Card. See www.dublinbus.ie for more information.

Taxis: There are usually taxis available throughout the day in the city centre. If you are travelling from outside the city centre, we recommend you order a taxi in advance:
